- Drive forward the preparation for an EU Public Private Partnership for the Vessels for the Future;
- Contribute proactively to technical developments at EU and international level (e.g. EEDI, passenger ship safety, Monitoring Reporting and Verification, etc.);
- Cooperate with other technical personnel from European and International partner associations;
- Liaise with the European Institutions (e.g. DG MOVE, DG RTD), IMO and Member States to ensure that the interests of the European industry are taken into account in rule and policy making.

Requirements:

- Degree level in engineering or naval architecture plus a minimum of seven years technical experience in practice;
- Good understanding of the structure of the maritime technology industry;
- Good understanding of technical rule and policy making at the International Maritime Organisation (IMO) and European Union;
